PASS/FAIL RESOLUTION

In order to encourage more students to take upper-level classes, Juniors and Seniors may earn some credits on a "pass/fail" basis versus receiving a letter grade. The following criteria must be followed:

- 1. The student must be of Junior or Senior status.
- 2. The class to be designated pass/fail must be a 3rd or 4th year math/science course or an upper-level advanced course that is not required for graduation.
- 3. A student may take no more than 20 credits on a pass/fail basis during their high school career.
- 4. No more than 2 classes may be designated pass/fail in the same semester.
- 5. All signatures must be acquired according to the dates below. If school is not in session on the corresponding dates below, the signed pass/fail form will be due the next day school is in session.
 - a. Semester 1

i. Pass/fail signatures must be turned into the high school office by 3:30 on the 3rd Monday of September.

ii. The student must notify the instructor and high school principal if they would like to take the grade instead of the pass/fail designation for each class by 3:30 on the 3rd Monday of November.

b. Semester 2

i. Pass/fail signatures must be turned into the high school office by 3:30 on the 1st Monday of February

ii. The student must notify the instructor and high school principal if they would like to take the grade instead of the pass/fail designation for each class by:

Juniors - 3:30 on the 3rd Monday of April

Seniors - 3:30 on the 1st Monday of April

- 6. If the student elects to take the earned grade instead of the pass/fail designation, they must meet the deadlines listed in #5. The earned grade will count towards the GPA and will still count as 5 credits of allowable pass/fail designated credits (20 maximum total).
- 7. The completed pass/fail form with required signatures must be turned into the high school office by the deadlines listed in #5. If a student is not able to obtain a teacher signature due to circumstances outside of the student's control, they must speak with the high school principal and will still be held to the same deadlines listed in #5.
