## STUDENT HONORS AND AWARDS

The school district shall provide a program that establishes honors and awards including, but not limited to, academic letters, scholarships and good citizenship awards for students to assist them in setting goals. Students shall be made aware of honors and awards and the action necessary on the part of the student to achieve them.

## Honor Roll and Down List

An honor roll will be compiled and posted at the end of each nine-week period and at the end of each semester. There are three levels of honor rolls: 4.0, 3.5, 3.0 (Note: P.E. and music are not included when figuring honor roll percentages.)

Because academics are the primary reason for attending school, students who are failing in more than one subject area will be ineligible to participate in school activities for a one week period. Beginning on the third week of the year and the last school day of each week following, teachers will submit names of those students who are near failing or are failing in their classes. A student deemed ineligible could continue to practice but may not participate in activity events for the following week (Monday through Sunday).

## Valedictorian and Salutatorian

The senior student with the highest four-year scholastic average shall be declared the valedictorian; the student with the next highest scholastic average will be declared the salutatorian. In establishing scholastic average, grade point average will be rounded to the nearest one thousandth.

Only students who have attended the Creighton Community Public School for their final four semesters of their academic career will be considered for the valedictorian or salutatorian award.

All students who graduated with a grade point average of 3.5, or higher, will be considered honor students and will be recognized at graduation. All Students who graduated with a grade point average of 4.0, or higher, will be considered graduates with high honors and will be recognized at graduation.
